Celebrating 84 Years

Summer is fast approaching and we've had a busy spring. I want to thank you, our members, for making the 84th Annual Meeting of Members a success. Your participation in the week-long drive-thru registration was phenomenal.

This month, we are celebrating Founder's Day. On June 8, 1939, a group of citizens gathered at Winnsboro's Sion Presbyterian Church and organized Fairfield Electric Cooperative. The cost of membership was set at \$5 and volunteers went door to door taking applications for service. By August 1939, the co-op had more than 800 applications and the work to build lines and provide service soon began. The efforts of those founding members led to a cooperative that now serves more than 32,000 member-consumers in Fairfield, Kershaw, Richland, Chester, and York counties.

We are excited that the new Winnsboro office is open and serving our members. I want to thank you for your patience during the construction process as we operated from the temporary office. The new office, which has a drive-thru as well as a night drop box, will serve members for years to come.

In addition to our new office, there is new economic growth in our area as we welcome Scout Motors Inc. to the Blythewood area. Scout plans to build a manufacturing plant off Interstate 77 that will span approximately 1,600 acres, with the plant itself occupying 1,100 acres. Vehicle production is targeted to begin by the end of 2026.

As always, we remain committed to our local community. We recently awarded eight high school seniors in our service area \$1,000 Touchstone Energy® Scholarships. We also have several students that will represent the cooperative later this month at the Washington Youth Tour, and in July at the Cooperative Youth Summit that will take place at our state capitol.

Along with our dedication to recognizing and providing opportunities for the youth in our service area, we also like to honor those who make a difference in our local community. Last year, we recognized Malcolm Gordge as our Who Powers You contest winner for all the work he has done for Camp Discovery in Blythewood. Now, we're looking for our next honoree. If you know someone making a difference in your community, please tell us their story and they could win a prize. We are accepting nominations for the Who Powers You contest until July 31.

This coming year, I look forward to continuing to work with our employees as we expand the cooperative's strategic plan with action items that will improve safety and security, reliability of service, financial stability, member satisfaction, and quality team. Surge Guard Available For Residential Members

The surge protection device is installed at the meter. The fee is \$5.95 per month.

Surge Guard

As your electronic appliances and equipment become more and more complex, the

need for protection from harmful voltage surges increases. Fairfield Electric Cooperative has lightning and surge protection built into its system which guard against most voltage surges. Even with this protection, a voltage surge can reach your home.

Surge Guard from Fairfield Electric offers a two-stage approach.

Stage 1 calls for a meter base surge protector. The surge protector, installed behind the meter, will maintain a constant vigil, protecting the electrical power feed to your home 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, 365 days per year. There is no installation fee and the device is only \$5.95 per month.

Stage 2 is just as important and calls for the use of high-quality plug-in protectors for electronics such as televisions and computers. Plug-in devices are available at many electronic stores and retailers. When purchasing plug-in devices make sure they are high-quality and look at the product's warranty.

Fairfield Electric Cooperative members can purchase high quality plug-in protection devices through the cooperative and receive a discount. Go to Spikestop.com and enter the coupon code: "Coop" to receive a member discount.
